Pattonville ACT scores make impressive half-point gain

Scores continue to be above state, national averages

Recent results on the 2004 ACT college entrance exam showed a significant increase by students at Pattonville High School. The 226 seniors in the class of 2004 who took the ACT earned a composite score of 22, a significant increase from 21.5 the previous year.

“We are excited about the gains our students have made,” said Pattonville High School Principal Jeff Marion. “We’ve had a concerted focus over the past several years to increase the rigor and challenge that we offer our students and to increase the number of honors, advanced placement and college credit courses that students can take. I believe this is evidence those efforts are making a difference.”

Pattonville students continued to score above state and national averages on the ACT, as demonstrated in the 2004 scores. The 2003-04 state composite score was 21.5, and the national composite was 20.9.
