Distinction in academics

Earned Missouri's Distinction in Performance Award for academic excellence (2001-02, 2002-03, 2003-04, 2004-05, 2005-06, 2006-07, 2007-08, 2008-09, 2009-2010, 2010-2011, 2011-2012); Pattonville is one of only 24 K-12 districts in Missouri (out of more than 450) to earn the award every year it has been given

Perfect state review

Earned full reaccreditation from Missouri after achieving perfect scores on our Missouri School Improvement Program (MSIP) review in 2003 and 2008

Excelling on state standards

Earned perfect scores in Missouri's Annual Performance Report (APR), which measures a district's performance on academic standards such as ACT scores, MAP scores, dropout rate, etc. (2001, 2002, 2003, 2004, 2005, 2007, 2010, 2011)

Highest performing in state

Remington Traditional School named to state's Top 10 lists for highest performing schools 11 school years in a row and the most improved list three times. Also on the highest performing Top 10 lists in the state: Rose Acres Elementary (2006 and 2008) and Parkwood Elementary (2007)

Most improved in state

Schools named to the state's Top 10 lists for "most improved" schools in Missouri - Pattonville Heights Middle School (2002, 2003 and 2004), Holman Middle School (2003 and 2006) and Pattonville High School (2003 and 2006)

Highly qualified staff

Two Missouri Teachers of the Year and six other finalists for the award from Pattonville since 1986

Closing the gap

Recognized by the St. Louis Post-Dispatch, the Black Leadership Roundtable and the State Board of Education for narrowing the achievement gap for African-American students (2003, 2005, 2008)

Outstanding development

Winner of Missouri Commissioner of Education's Professional Development Award (2004)

Above average scores

ACT scores consistently above state and national average; scores on Missouri Assessment Program (MAP) also above state averages at all grade levels and state end-of-course exams place Pattonville High School among the tops in St. Louis region for many areas. Eighth-grade algebra scores on the end-of-course exams are among the highest in Missouri.

Offering what parents want

Ranked 10 times in the top 16 percent of schools nationwide that are delivering what parents want, according to SchoolMatch, an independent, national education and research consulting firm

Sharing successes

Invited in 2003 and 2004 to make presentations to the state Board of Education, the Missouri Commissioner's Education Conference and the National Effective Schools Conference on student achievement and narrowing the achievement gap

Blue Ribbon Schools

Earned federal Blue Ribbon Award - Pattonville High School (1992), Holman Middle School (1985) and Pattonville Heights Middle School (1984)

Nationally certified

Teachers annually completing the rigorous National Board Certification - 21 Pattonville teachers since 1999

Leader in character education

Pattonville High School - one of two high schools nationwide named a "School of Character" by Business Week magazine and the Character Education Partnership (1998) - also named a National Service Learning School (2000); Pattonville schools have won the Character Education Partnership's "Promising Practices" Award - Willow Brook Elementary in 2009 and Holman Middle School in 2011.



A Perfect Score

During Pattonville's 2003 reaccreditation review, the state identified several strengths in Pattonville's instructional program. They are:

1. Pattonville's school improvement plan drives all phases of the district planning process and is focused on student achievement. It is an example of comprehensive planning and could serve as a model for other districts.
2. The district provides services for gifted students that exceed the requirements of the state's standard.
3. Questionnaire responses from faculty and staff indicate that the district provides numerous professional development opportunities that have a direct relationship to improving student achievement.
4. The Pattonville Board of Education provides numerous opportunities for patrons, parents, students and staff to have input into the programs and policies of the district. The level of participation of district patrons could serve as a model for other districts.
5. The Pattonville High School library is open until 7 p.m. Monday through Thursday, providing extended access to the library media center resources for students and community members.
6. The district has a desirable student to staff ratio in all areas.
7. Pattonville was also cited for academic performance on the MAP, attendance rate, dropout ratio, advanced course work and students' scores on the ACT.
